

Political party leaders discuss reform drive

AMMAN – Representatives of political parties and movements on Tuesday called for reaching consensus on a new elections law to boost political life in Jordan.

During a roundtable discussion at Al Rai Centre for Research, they stressed the importance of involving all political movements in drafting the law, according to a statement issued by the centre.

Speakers also called for reforming government agencies and building trust between the authorities and political parties.

Rheil Gharaibeh, Muslim Brotherhood member and founder of the National Initiative for Building (Zamzam), unveiled plans to call for national dialogue soon to reach consensus among all political powers on key issues related to reform.
